Water

Municipal water service is provided by the City of Battle Creek. There are currently no limitations on water in Battle Creek.

- Capacity of our water system is 30 million gallons per day (MGD)
- Average daily usage is around 10 million gallons per day.

This provides Battle Creek with an abundant or excess capacity of 20 million gallons daily. In Battle Creek the cost of industrial water averages \$1.16 per CCF (100 cubic feet). For more information please contact the [City of Battle Creek](#).

Sewer

Municipal sanitary sewer service is provided by the City of Battle Creek. There are currently no limitations on sanitary sewer in Battle Creek.

- Capacity of our sewer system is 30 million gallons per day (MGD)
- Average daily usage is around 10 million gallons per day.

This provides Battle Creek with an abundant or excess capacity of 20 million gallons daily. In Battle Creek the cost of sewer averages \$2.89 per CCF (100 cubic feet). For more information, please contact the [City of Battle Creek](#).

Telecommunications and Fiber Optic/Broadband

Phone and telecommunications service is available to all sites located within Fort Custer Industrial Park by multiple service providers - including AT&T and CTS Telecom.

Both providers have extensive fiber optic systems in Fort Custer Industrial Park with high-speed, broadband, and digital service. Battle Creek thrives in the IT world with a community-wide fiber network delivering up to 10 Gigabytes through existing infrastructure, about 10 times the national norm. With 300 local miles of a 1,000 mile Southwest Michigan network, the fiber infrastructure continues to expand. At W.K. Kellogg Airport, residents and tenants are literally surrounded by fiber.
